



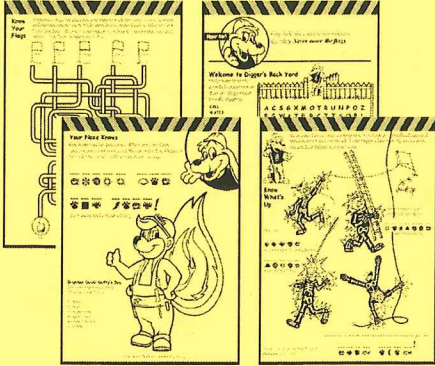

Dear Educator,

It's that time of year again! Georgia 811's mascot, Digger Dog, is traveling throughout the state of Georgia promoting the message of safe digging and wants to visit your elementary school. Digger provides a fun, interactive, **FREE** program designed to equip young Georgians with the tools and information needed to protect themselves in hazardous situations. He will share with your students information about safe digging, smelling gas and acting fast, and safety techniques to use around overhead electrical lines in his 35-minute energetic, informative, and life-



saving presentation. Learn more about this program by visiting www.Georgia811.com.

Information in Digger's presentation has been geared for second and third grade, but may be presented to other age groups at your request. His message fits several of the criteria found in both Grade Two and Grade Three of Georgia's Performance Standards. **Students will have the opportunity to review gas and energy properties; enhance their vocabulary, communication, and media comprehension skills; and improve their safety-consciousness.** For example, Digger will demonstrate some of electricity's natural changes by telling the students what to do around downed power lines. Also, Digger will demonstrate what happens when electricity is manipulated as objects come into contact with overhead high voltage power lines. He will also describe the hazards of a natural gas leak and what to do if you smell gas. Students are encouraged to

participate and ask questions to gain more information during Digger's presentation. We will also leave behind an eight-page workbook, with a Digger Dog Utility Safety Program completion certificate for each student. The workbook contains activities such as a word search, maze, and decoding of a secret message that all serve to build skills found under the Language Arts Standards while reinforcing the safety messages heard in Digger's show.
