




Know Your Lines


Your house

Know Your Flags

Sometimes, flags are placed in your yard to mark the utility lines so workers and parents can dig safely. Each utility line is marked with a different color. Color the flags, then use your crayon to follow the utility line over and under other lines to reach its utility.




