The updated Georgia Underground Marking Standards (PSC Rule 515-9-4.14) went into effect on January 11, 2024. This presentation will include a comprehensive review of the PSC Rule with an emphasis on 2024 changes that include the communication of "no conflict" ticket responses, updated language regarding the requirement to use paint for marking, the marking of bundled lines that share a trench, marking of ducts, and marking requirements for traffic control and traffic management systems.
